CARES Act – CDC Coronavirus State, Local, and Tribal Grants Minimum Awards

The coronavirus emergency funding package includes minimum CDC assistance awards to States, Cities, and Territories representing 100 percent of their FY 2019 awards through the Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) program. If needed, grantees will also be eligible to apply to CDC for additional assistance from over \$750 million more in state and local funding included in the package. There also is a set-aside for tribes, tribal organizations, and urban Indian health organizations.
